DIRECTORS NOTES

Locked In takes its inspiration from two true stories 'Ghost Boy' by Martin Pistorius and 'The Diving Bell and the Butterfly' by Jean-Dominique Bauby who both shared their experiences of living with Locked-In Syndrome in memoir. Locked-In syndrome (LIS) is a condition in which a patient is aware but cannot move or communicate verbally due to complete paralysis of nearly all voluntary muscles in the body except for the eyes.

"However much I tried to beg and pleas, shout and scream, I couldn't make them notice me"

These two stories epitomised hope and gratitude under the most extreme adversity. Yet in this living hell there seemed to be an untapped reservoir of human imagination. This is a challenging story of love, commitment and tragedy while at the same time an inquiry into the way in which we perceive (or fail to perceive) the beauty and detail of the world around us.

The process by which we tried to bring these sentiments to life on the stage was based on tasked based improvisation. Starting with extensive research into Locked-In Syndrome and visceral provocations from the books themselves specific physical tasks were set and investigated through improvisation. Because Locked-In Syndrome robs the person of language it was a conscious decision to not rely on words but to create a script of physical connections. The limitations of the condition encouraged us to re-imagine silence and awakened our senses to the infinite possibilities hidden in the stillness.

"I can listen to the butterflies that flutter inside my head. To hear them one must be calm and pay close attention, for their wingbeats are barely audible. Loud breathing is enough to drown them out"
